Sangiovese is the most commonly planted red grape in Italy, but southern regions such as Campania and Basilicata bank on *Aglianico*, which makes full-bodied, complex wines, such as the examples from <u>Donnachiara</u>.

WS review: A smoky note up front underscores the baked cherry and dried fig fruit on the palate of this medium- to full-bodied red. Accents of cured tobacco and spice linger on the finish, firmed by well-knit tannins. Drink now through 2024. 1,700 cases made; 550 cases imported. - *A.N.*
